Sulannah & W.m. Taverner, Mother and Son, were put to the bar, at the Old Bailey, and indicted for unlawfully having in their poffettion a quantity of 1 and 11 forged notes of the Bank of Eng

Joseph Mayhew said he was Guard of the Old Prince of Walcs, Birmingham Coach. He knows Wm. Taverner wel!. On the 4th April, he took his place to go to Veery Cross, 4 miles from Stratford Witness set him down there. On the return of the Coach from Birmingham, Wm. Taverner came to London again, and witness got from a woman a basket to take with him, directed to a "Mrs Ward, Clerkenwell." Witness had reason to suspect that there was something in the basket which was not right.

Mi Ibbetson recollected the basket coming by the Birmingham Old Prince of Wales Coach; he opened it and found it to contain 2 fowls, and some rolls of bank-notes.—Guilty

Thomas Jeffcoit was put to the bar a second time upon an indictment sharging him with stealing and secreting a certain letter, containing 101 Battk of England note. Guilty-Death

John Sandyford, aged 10 and Henry Nicholson, aged 25, were indicted for burglariously breaking and entering the dwelling house of Sarah Whitmore, on 10th March last, and stealing 7 gowns, sheets, wearing apparel. Guilty=Death.

Thomas Bradbury, aged 16, was in ; dicted for feloniously uisposing of and putting away 3 false and counterfeit bank-notes for 11 each, with intent to ds= fraud the Bank of Eog. Guilty -D ath. J. Harris, and C. Elliott, for high= way robbery, Guilty-Death. Caroline Snieed and Eliz. Edwards for stealing 2 pair of gold carrings, from 5, Jefferson, St Martin's-court, Guily -Death.
