The collection consists of a recording of Robert F. Kennedy's 18 March 1966 address on the University of Mississippi campus.

#### HISTORICAL NOTE

Robert F. Kennedy played a pivotal role in the history of the University of Mississippi. As U.S. Attorney General, he directed the U.S. Marshals to accompany James H. Meredith on campus in 1962 as Meredith became the first African American to register at the state's flagship institution. After rioters attacked the Marshals, President John F. Kennedy ordered in federal troops to restore order.

In 1966, U.S. Senator Robert F. Kennedy accepted an invitation from the Speaker's Bureau of the University of Mississippi Law School to address the students. Although protests preceded the event, Kennedy's speech before a crowd of 6,000 proved successful, generating much good will and enthusiasm.

#### Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of a recording of Robert F. Kennedy's address at the University of Mississippi on 18 March 1966. Kennedy's introduction is by the Speaker's Bureau chairman, Ed Ellington. Kennedy discusses Mississippi and the American South, civil rights, education, labor, foreign relations, the youth movement, and volunteerism.
