REGIONAL CONFERENCES

The first regional conference for this year will be held in Cleveland, Ohio, on May 27 and 28. The hostess for AWSCPA and ASWA will be the Cleveland Chapter, which will be celebrating its Fifth Anniversary. Conference headquarters will be at the Hotel Cleveland which is centrally located. Business and social activities will be included in the conference.

Alice Aubert, National President of ASWA, will conduct a "Workshop" on Saturday morning. Pertinent problems and suggested solutions will be discussed at this meeting. A luncheon, with a prominent speaker, is planned for Saturday noon. The national board and the Chapter Presidents will hold meetings on Saturday afternoon.
