The American Association of Public Accountants

Gentlemen:

The 1913 Year Book of The American Association of Public Accountants will be published on or before December 20th, 1913, and I desire to urge upon you the importance of securing copies of this valuable contribution to the literature of accountancy.

Since the 1912 Year Book was issued seven additional states have enacted C. P. A. laws. The full text of these laws will be found in the forthcoming year book.

Among the committee reports presented at the Boston convention were several of peculiar interest. Particular attention should be devoted to the reports of the committees on accounting terminology, education and state legislation.

The report of the committee on accounting terminology covers approximately seventy pages of the year book and contains the most extensive list of definitions to be found in any American work.

The report of the committee on state legislation reviews the recent enactments of C. P. A. legislation and in addition contains special recommendations for the requirements which should be embodied in all state laws.

The report of the committee on education carries still further the excellent work reported in the 1912 Year Book and is of considerable interest to every member of the accounting profession.

The proceedings of the convention in Boston contain several excellent papers on accounting subjects together with a full report of the discussion following each paper.

The statistical portion of the book, containing lists of membership of the association and state societies, with street addresses, and the list of C. P. A. examiners, constitute a record which should be in every accountant's office.

I earnestly request that every member of the association obtain a copy of the 1913 Year Book as I feel that without the official record no member can keep in close touch with the many activities which the association is undertaking.

The year book will be published at \$1.50, (post paid \$1.70) by The Ronald Press Company, 20 Vesey Street, New York City.
