My Dear Mr. Dickinson:

Mr. Kennedy tells me that you would like to have information as to the several hotels of Columbus together with rates, etc. The four principal hotels, named in order of their desirability together with the rates, are as follows:

HOTEL HARTMAN (European plan only) Corner Fourth & Main Sts., \$1.50 to \$6.00 per day.

SOUTHERN HOTEL (Both American and European plan), located at Main & High Streets, (European plan, \$1.00 to \$3.00 per day; American plan, \$2.50 to \$5.00 per day).

HOTEL CHITTENDEN (American plan only), located corner High & Spring Streets, \$3.00 to \$6.00 per day.

NEIL HOUSE (European plan only), located on High Street, between Broad and State, directly opposite the Capitol; rates \$1.50 to \$3.00 per day.

There are, of course, a number of smaller hotels on the American plan, with rates from \$1.50 to \$2.50 per day and up. The Hotel Hartman and the Southern are located within two blocks of each other, and the Hotel Hartman is one of the best equipped and most handsomely furnished hotels in the State. The dining room is, in my opinion, fully equal to the St. Nicholas at Cincinnati, or the Hollenden at Cleveland. We have already arranged for some of the best rooms to be reserved at the Hotel Hartman, and a special committee from the Ohio State Society has been appointed to arrange for hotel accommodations. The Chairman of this Committee, Mr. H. A. Keller, 16 E. Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, will be glad to make any reservations for any or all members of the Association. We expect to have a number of sub-committees, and I will within the next few days, send you the names and addresses of the various members of the Ohio State Society who will serve on such committees and who, of course, will co-operate in every possible way with the American Association Committee on Arrangements.
