ARTICLE III. Associated Societies.

State Societies, under the name of Associated Section 1. Societies, may be admitted as a whole, by a two-thirds vote of those present at any meeting of the Board of Trustees, and the individual members of such Society, by such admission, shall become members of this Association, the State Society being responsible for the fees and dues of their members, as hereinafter provided for in Article VI of the By-Laws.

Section 2. Associated Societies shall have the right at any meeting to cast the entire vote of their membership as a unit, upon their filing with the Secretary a resolution to that effect.

Section 3. Members belonging to more than one Associated Society shall be enrolled, either at large, or from that Society which they may

Amend the Py-Laws as follows:

In Article II, Section 1, after the "ords "the members" add "absent members may cast their votes by proxy, for the election of "all efficers, and upon all questions which may be brought up at any "meeting of the Association."

Amend Article VI, Section 3, by adding after the words "Fiscal year" the words "Provided, nevertheless, that the fees for members of "'Associated Societies' shall be one-half of the amounts imposed in "the above sections."

After the word "month" in Section 4, of Article II of By-Laws, relating to meetings of the Board of Trustees, add "except during the months of July and August, unless ordered otherwise by the President.

At the conclusion of the business the members will dine together as guests of the Association.
