By the way, Dr. Hogan sends you his regards. He says you are outstanding in the profession for intellectual honesty which, to my mind, is about the nicest compliment a person could receive.

Since all of the trouble at Ole Miss I've heard a rumor making the rounds here that the N.D.E.A. fellowship at the University of Mississippi had been ~~rescinded~~ rescinded. For the sake of my friends still left there I hope it isn't true.

We were able to get a fairly large apartment only 10 blocks from Tulane and we are slowly furnishing it with articles from the Goodwill stores. Both Phyllis and I hope that if you are ever able to make it to New Orleans both you and your family will be able to come and see us. I
