Dear Mr. Brockway.

The American Institute of Accountants would like to have some information in regard to the Maine Board of Accountancy and its connection with the Holman's National School of Accountancy, and has asked me if I have any information regarding this matter.

I hesitate to say very much about it, knowing that three of your assistants passed through this school and have also received C. P. A. certificates from the State of Maine, and before giving such information as I have, or making an attempt to obtain any further data, I should like to know whether or not you care to have me give the information.
