LECTURE AND STUDY GROUP

Your committee has arranged a spring series of three meetings, to be held at The Town Hall Club, 123 West 43rd Street, New York, N. Y., on Tuesday evenings, April 29, May 6 and May 13, 1941.

William D. Cranstoun, editor of "The Commentator" department of *The Journal of Accountancy*, will lead the discussion at the first meeting on "Interesting Recent Annual Reports from an Accountant's Viewpoint." Several members of the group will discuss unusual treatment of balance-sheet and income-statement items in current reports. All members attending the meeting are urged to bring with them, copies of annual reports including features which might serve as a basis of discussion.

At the second meeting, on May 6th, Samuel J. Broad, chairman of the committee on auditing procedure, will lead discussion of the seven bulletins on auditing procedure, recently published.

The last meeting, on May 13th, will be led by Thomas H. Sanders, director and coordinator of the research department of the American Institute of Accountants. Discussion will be centered upon the research department's tentative statement on "Inventories," which appeared in the April, 1941, issue of *The Journal of Accountancy*. It is expected that state society presidents and members of Council (including members of the committee on accounting procedure from out-of-town) who will be attending the spring meeting of Council, will attend the session and enter into discussion of this controversial subject.

As in the past, the meetings will be held in The Town Hall Club, 123 West 43rd Street, New York, N. Y. Dinner will be served at 6:00 p.m., at a price of \$1.60 (inclusive of gratuities and sales tax). Discussion will begin at 7:00 p.m., and the meeting will adjourn shortly after 9:00 p.m. Since the club rooms are made available to the group without cost, all those who can conveniently do so are urged to come to the dinner. Members of the group unable to attend the dinner will of course be welcome at the subsequent discussion.
