Samuel F. Parker, CPA: Alabama Society of CPAs

Mr. Parker was named Alabama Volunteer Industrial Developer of the year in 1985, and was responsible for bringing several high-payroll industries into southern Alabama. He also served as past president of both the Foley Rotary Club and the South Baldwin Chamber of Commerce.

J. Chris Swalling, CPA: Alaska Society of CPAs

Mr. Swalling is currently chairman of special events for the Alaska Multiple Sclerosis Society and has served on the society's board of directors for 13 years. He was also an integral member of the Anchorage Organizing Committee, whose purpose was to have Alaska host the Olympic Winter Games. The committee's efforts brought international exposure to Alaska.

Jack A. Henry, CPA: Arizona Society of CPAs

Mr. Henry is chairman of the board of the Phoenix Economic Growth Corporation. He has served as treasurer of the corporation since its inception in 1986. As a founding member, he helped create Phoenix's first professional economic development organization. He has also served on the Super Bowl '93 Committee, which was instrumental in bringing the Super Bowl to Phoenix in 1993.
