

AICPA LIBRARY GUIDE



The AICPA library was established in 1918 to serve the information and research needs of including 800 current subscriptions, over 150 tax and financial looseleaf services, and over the Institute's then 1,300 members. The collection has grown in seventy years from 2,000 books and pamphlets to over 92,000 books and pamphlets, plus 1,200 periodical titles 93,000 corporate annual reports (U.S. and foreign) on microfiche. In a typical day, the Library Services staff answers over 100 telephone requests and assists 50 to 60 visitors. A major research source published by the Library Services Division is the Accountants' Index. This is the resource used to gain subject access to the information in our collection. The Index has been published regularly since 1920. Index contents, from 1974 to present, are available through the on-line database, ACCOUNTANTS. A monthly AICPA Library Acquisitions List is available to members on request to assist them in keeping current on new publications.

The library's unique collection of historical and current accounting and business literature is drawn upon substantially by outside researchers, professionals, scholars and students as well as AICPA members

LIBRARY COLLECTION

The library's collection concentrates on information dealing with the accountancy profession, with the main emphasis in the areas of accounting, auditing, and taxation. The comprehensiveness of coverage in these areas is equalled by few if any libraries in the country.

What can the library do for you?

Bibliographies

Photocopies will be made from the Accountants' Index for pertinent subject areas relating to your request. This bibliography will list articles, books and pamphlets in the library pertaining to your subject from which you can select materials.

Reference assistance

A librarian will research your request for relevant information. We as how to value a dental practice or accounting for bankruptcy. If the answer requests ranging from specific information such as stock quotes* or foreign exchange rates* to broader subject requests such library does not have information relating to your question, we will refer you, when possible, to other sources of information.

*Data base searches

The library has access to hundreds of data bases which we will search for you upon request. Information retrieved may include bibliographic citations, abstracts, financial information, statistics, cases, or tax decisions/rulings.

*Photocopying

Specific articles, cases, tax decisions/rulings, tax forms, stock quotes, Consumer Price Index figures, or annual reports will be photocopied upon request.

ACCOUNTANTS' INDEX

The Accountants' Index, first published in 1920, is the catalog of the AICPA library as well tancy profession. References in the index refer to books, pamphlets, government documents, and articles available in the library. The Accountants' Index may be purchased on a subscription basis, which includes three quarterly supplements plus the cumulative annual. The annual bound publication, which now contains over 1,700 pages in two as the only bibliographic reference guide to the English language literature for the accounvolumes, can also be purchased separately. 

DATABASE—ACCOUNTANTS

While the database contains the same information as the *Accountants' Index* (from 1974 to present), on-line searching allows for greater speed and specificity in locating bibliographic citations. The searcher is able to combine one or more subject terms to zero in on information needed. By contacting the library, a search on ACCOUNTANTS can be performed for you for a fee.

LIBRARY RULES

Borrowing

Up to ten items may be borrowed at a time. The loan period is two weeks from the date borrowed. Allowance will be made for time lost in delivery.

Renewals

Provided no application has been made for the same item, a renewal for 2 weeks will be granted. Renewal by telephone is permitted.

Delivery

Materials are sent first class or priority insured mail. Borrowers pay the cost for materials sent both ways. Overnight delivery* or fax* available upon request.

Loss or damage

Borrowers are responsible for materials sent to them, including risk of loss in the mail when returning to the library. Materials should be wrapped securely and returned priority insured mail.

Non-circulating materials

Reference works, bound journals, newspapers and materials that cannot be replaced do not circulate.

Nonmembers

The library is open for research use to the public. Coin-operated photocopy machines are available.
