Brown, Richard C., ed. <u>A History of Accounting and Accountants</u>. Edinburgh: Frank Cass and Co., Ltd., 1905.

Covers the history of accounting from ancient systems of Babylonia, Egypt and Rome to 1905, with one chapter on the United States. Book concludes with a note on future developments.

Carey, John L. <u>The Rise of the Accounting Profession: From</u> <u>Technician to Profession, 1896-1936</u>, New York: American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, 1969.

A two-volume work by the former administrative vice president of the AICPA covering 1896 to 1969, this book "relates the development of the profession to the changing environment."

Edwards, James D. <u>History of Public Accounting in the United</u> States. University of Alabama Press, 1960.

Covers the history of the profession from its antecedents in Britain and in the United States from 1748 to the 1950's.

Frey, Ralph W. "Public Accounting Profession: The Impact External Environmental Factors from 1900-1971." Ph.D. dissertation, University of Maryland, 1972.

Traces the political, economic and legal factors, and their influence on the profession's development of professional guidelines and accounting and auditing standards.

Lubell, Myron S. "Significance of Organizational Conflict on the Legislative Evolution of the Accounting Profession in the United States." Ph.D. dissertation, University of Maryland, 1978.

Reviews the legislative history of the accounting profession in the United States from 1896 to 1956, and covers the conflict between the National Society of Public Accountants and the American Institute of CPAs through 1976. Miranti, Paul J. "From Conflict to Consensus: The American Institute of Accountants and the Professionalization of Public Accountancy." Ph.D. dissertation, Johns Hopkins University, 1985.

Focuses on the American Institute of Accountants and its predecessor, the American Association of Public Accountants, from 1886 to 1940, and how the American Institute ultimately succeeded in establishing an "effective structure and program for ordering activities in the new profession of public accountancy."

Olsen, Wallace E. <u>The Accounting Profession, Years of Trial:</u> <u>1969-1980</u>. New York: American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, 1982.

Covers the major technical and professional developments of the 1970's.

Stevens, Mark. <u>The Accounting Wars</u>. New York: Macmillan, 1985.

Covers the competitive nature of accounting firms today.
