Young in London in August, shortly after his appointment as Agent General of Reparations, and for three months was actively connected with Mr. Young in Paris and Berlin in the institution of the Experts' Plan in Germany. Mr. Auld was eminently qualified for his duties with Mr. Young, having previously been a member of the interallied board to recommend an organization for the accounting department of the Reparations Commission, and having served for four years as Accountant General for the Reparations Commission in Paris, during which time he was in charge of accounts showing claims on Germany, quantity and value of German payments and deliveries, and their actual distribution among the Allies. Mr. Auld will be connected in future with our New York Broad Street office.

Mr. O. N. Hutchinson, of our Baltimore office, has been elected to membership in the American Institute of Accountants.
