Sturdivant family honors matriarch and school's founding dean

OXFORD, Miss. – A recent major gift to the **University of Mississippi** will bolster the Sturdivant Journalism Award Endowment Fund, created in 2010 to recognize students poised to graduate with highest honors from the **School of Journalism and New Media**.

The Sturdivant family made the gift in honor of their matriarch, Ygondine Walker Sturdivant, a former Miss Ole Miss who earned a bachelor's degree in English and psychology in 1948.

"This is a lovely surprise and one that I appreciate," said Sturdivant, of Glendora. "I have been very blessed with a wonderful family and that they would make this gift in my name makes it even more meaningful to me."

The family's gift also represents Sturdivant's respect for Will Norton, UM journalism dean.

Norton said he is honored by the gift.
