Airport Update

Newark's New Terminal C

Continental Airlines has consolidated its Newark flights in the 41 gates of the new terminal C and has pulled out of terminal B. The Airline's shuttle flights and continental express commuter service are also being transferred. The daily parking lots are now \$18 for 24 hours, and the long-term lots are \$3 for the first 12 hours, \$1 for an hour after that but a maximum of \$5 for 24 hours. A shuttle bus is scheduled to serve the long-term lots every 15 to 20 minutes around the clock.

Airline Tickets

Please notify the travel department or make note on your travel request form if you will need your ticket on a specific date. Airline tickets are usually issued two days before traveling, unless an advanced purchase is required.

Getting Around—Los Angeles

Climate: Midday temperatures June to October average 83 and 65 from November to May.

Gratuities: Waiters—15% of the bill, increasing to 20% or more for attentive service

Bartenders—.50-.75 per drink

Taxicab drivers—15% added to the fare Doormen/bellhops—\$1.00 per bag

Transportation—Airport to Downtown

Car Rentals: On Airport Operators are located on the Ground Level of each terminal

Taxis: Average fares between the Airport and Downtown Los Angeles are \$25-\$28. Trip takes

30-45 minutes depending upon traffic.

Super Shuttle: Door-to-door service seven days a week, 24 hours a day. Fare is \$10 per person. Call

for pick up and they will arrive within 15 minutes. Advance reservations recom-

In the City:

Public Buses: The RTD runs throughout the Downtown area. The average fare based on the different

zones is \$1-2.

Taxis: Cab stands are at the bus terminals and major hotels. Taxis may also be ordered by telephone. Taxis do not cruise city streets looking for passengers. Fares are \$1.90 flag drop, then an

additional \$1.40 per mile.
