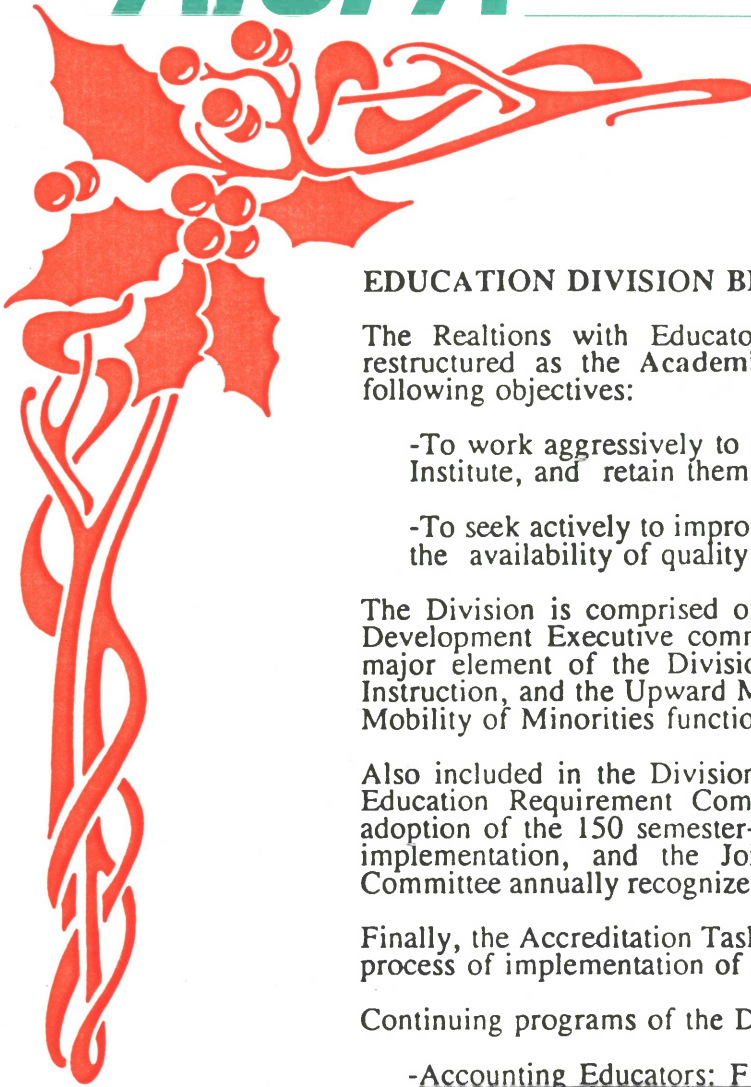

EDUCATION DIVISION BROADENS FOCUS

The Relations with Educators Division has broadened its focus and been restructured as the Academic and Career Development Division with the following objectives:

- To work aggressively to attract qualified people into the profession and the Institute, and retain them after they enter; and
- To seek actively to improve the quality of accounting education and promote the availability of quality accounting programs.

The Division is comprised of a senior committee: The Academic and Career Development Executive committee, and three committees each addressing one major element of the Division's focus: Accounting Careers, Curriculum and Instruction, and the Upward Mobility of Women. The Recruitment and Upward Mobility of Minorities function is also included in the expanded division.

Also included in the Division are two task-specific committees: the 150-Hour Education Requirement Committee develops programs to achieve legislative adoption of the 150 semester-hour education requirement and help states in its implementation, and the Joint AICPA/AAA Accounting Literature Award Committee annually recognizes outstanding contributions to accounting literature.

Finally, the Accreditation Task Force monitors and provides input to the ongoing process of implementation of accreditation standards.

Continuing programs of the Division include:

- Accounting Educators: FYI newsletter provides a forum for the exchange of ideas and innovative techniques in accounting education;
- AICPA Doctoral Fellowships provide tuition assistance to CPAs returning to school to obtain doctoral degrees in preparation for a career in accounting education;
- Development of videos, brochures, and other materials to attract students to the profession;
- An annual Accounting Careers Conference coordinates AICPA and state societies' recruitment activities;
- The annual Supply and Demand Report surveys the supply of new accounting graduates and their demand among public accounting firms; and
- Development of materials and presentations to help states obtain legislation for 150-semester hours of education to sit for the CPA exam.

Plans currently under development include a curriculum development conference for accounting educators, CPE workshops for accounting faculty focusing on instructional skills, and implementation of a marketing/communications plan to raise awareness of the profession and attract exemplary individuals.

Supporting the Division is a staff of ten: Vice President Rick Elam, Director Bea Sanders, Managers Stephen Anspacher, John Daidone, and Mary McInnes, Coordinator Leticia Romeo, Administrative Assistant Marlene Gallagher and Secretaries Sherry Boothe, Paulette Myers and Rosalynd Rambert.
