Night of the Shooting Stars

Keep an eye in the sky on August 12th and 13th. Since the year 830, sky watchers have observed an annual meteor shower that seems to originate in the constellation Perseus. Its peak arrives so punctually on the night of August 11 that the date has come to be known as the "Night of the Shooting Stars." (Because 1992 is a leap year, the stars will be a day late, beginning on the 12th.)

Observers everywhere in the world but the South Pole may see as many as 60 meteors an hour lighting up the sky as they enter the earth's atmosphere. Each one may be tiny, but they all shine brightly in the sky.

The Perseus constellation is located in the northern hemisphere near Andromeda and Auriga.

Keep an eye on the sky on August 12th and 13th. If you ever wanted to make a wish on a falling star, you will not have a better opportunity for some time.
