Environmental Facts for You

If one person used his own ceramic mug in the office each day, he could eliminate as many as 500 throwaway cups a year.

A single office worker using a half-page cover sheet, instead of a full page, would save about six rolls of paper each year. Using stick-on fax labels instead would save even more.

Wasting water contributes to the greenhouse effect because of the energy it takes to pump, purify and treat the water before use.

Microwave ovens can reduce consumption of electricity by 25 to 40 percent when used for cooking instead of a conventional oven.

Aluminum, glass and steel can be recycled almost indefinitely.

Recycling one ton of office paper saves 17 trees. It takes 60 percent less energy to manufacture paper from recycled stock than from new material. Every ton of recycled paper saves 4,200 kilowatts of energy and 7,000 gallons of water.

A properly tuned car gets about 40 percent better gas mileage, emits 42 percent fewer hydrocarbons and 47 percent less carbon monoxide.

Commuting by public transportation takes as little as one-thirtieth the energy needed to commute by car.
