Take Note**

It has come to our attention that Prudential has incorrectly been applying a \$50 co-payment for emergency room visits. The correct co-payment is currently \$25. If you submitted a claim for emergency room services against which the \$50 co-payment was applied, please contact Chris Miller on X3354 so that the necessary adjustments can be made and the additional benefits paid. Also, all employees (except those hired on or after 8/1/92) who have an ID card showing a \$50 "ER Co-Pay" should contact Chris Miller to receive a corrected card. Employees hired on or after 8/1/92 will automatically receive a new card shortly.

Also, in accordance with New York law, effective 1/1/93, an annual pelvic examination and pap smear are covered under the out-of-network portion of the PruCare plan for females age 18 and older. This coverage, which applies to PruCare members regardless of state of residence, includes diagnostic and laboratory services in connection with examining and evaluating the pap smear. (Coverage for these services was previously provided in-network only.)
