**New Telephone
System for
Washington**

AICPA's Washington, D.C. office will have a new telephone system effective Monday, September 26. The new system is identical to the systems installed at the Institute's Harborside and New York (1211) facilities.

When the new system is on line, Washington D.C. staff will no longer be required to dial the "116" code before Harborside and New York facility extension numbers when dialing over tie lines.

Distance
Service**

On Monday, September 19, most long distance calls from AICPA's Harborside and New York facilities began being routed over the AT&T long distance network. This change was enacted to save the Institute long distance calling costs and improve service.
