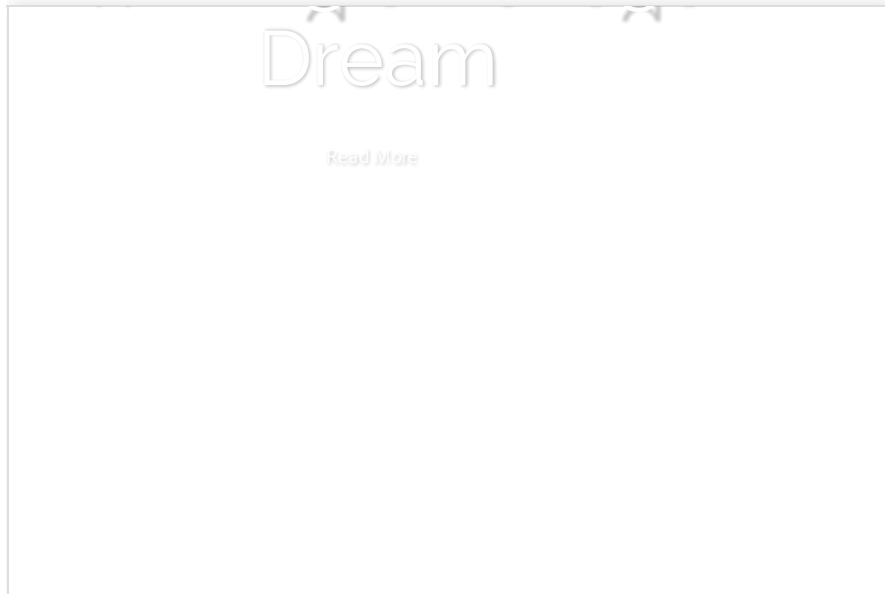


Growing up, Madison Varner knew the burden of paying for college would rest squarely on her shoulders.
