Satisfying Their Wanderlust

UM law alumnus Oliver Diaz and wife explore the world in retirement, one country at a time

OXFORD, Miss. — A law degree can open a door to so many opportunities. For Oliver Diaz, a graduate of the University of Mississippi School of Law, a storied career has led to him telling his own stories of travel.

Diaz earned his degree from the law school in 1985 and later received a Master of Laws from the University of Virginia. He practiced law on the Gulf Coast while representing Biloxi and D'Iberville in the Mississippi House of Representatives for seven years.

After serving as city attorney for D'Iberville, Diaz was elected to the Mississippi Court of Appeals in 1994. He was appointed to the state Supreme Court in 2000 and elected in 2001. In 2008, he returned to private practice.

With children grown and out of the house, Diaz and his wife, Jennifer, toyed around with the idea of traveling the world.

"We'd always talked about traveling places and doing something like that but never had the time while I was working," Diaz said.

As a lawyer and retired judge, he was often asked to speak in different locations around the United States. However, Diaz had never really spent much time traveling outside the country.

"It's hard to take time away from clients," he said.

After one family friend was diagnosed with cancer and another suffered a heart attack, the Diazes realized that if they wanted to experience the world, the time was now. But the Diazes aren't just taking weeklong trips to Europe. They are exploring every comer of the world, about eight months at a time.

He loved practicing law, and leaving that behind was tough at first.

"I decided to take a sabbatical and thought if travel didn't work out, I could always return to my practice," he said.

Last year, the Diazes explored eight countries in South America. They flew from New Orleans to Colombia and began the journey.

When the couple travels, the itinerary is flexible; the Diazes are also not booking luxury resorts. When traveliculture, so they stay at local hotels and hostels to meet locals and other travelers.

They also book travel arrangements during offpeak times, so locations are less crowded.

"Traveling most of the year is cheaper than living at is getting there."
