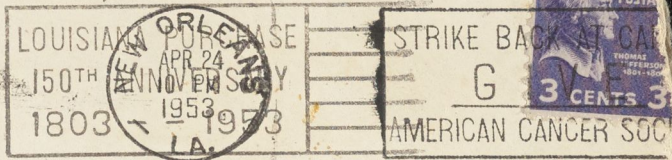
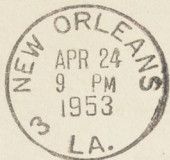
Too bad about the Award, but maybe it's just as well. It would make my income taxes pretty big next year if I'd got it. And I didn't much think I would anyhow, I guess.
